Amanda Elliott was appointed the first female chairman of the Victoria Racing Club (VRC) in February 2017. She had previously served as the vice chairman.

Elliott was elected to the VRC Committee in 2002, making her the second female committee member ever appointed. She went on to become the first female vice chairman in 2011 and has played an integral role in pursuing the VRC's Masterplan to enhance the race-day experience at Flemington for members and the public.

During her time on the VRC board, Elliott served on a diverse range of committees, including the Australian Stud Book and director of Australian Genetics Testing, which was sold in 2015. She has been chairman of the Design Group for the new Club Stand for five years, as well as a member of the Audit and Risk, Masterplan and Steering sub-committees.

Elliott comes from a family with a long history of Thoroughbred racing, breeding and administration. Her father was vice chairman of the VRC and a long-standing committeeman of the club. Her respect for the heritage, history and traditions of the VRC is extremely important to her as she looks to the future.

Elliott has a Bachelor of Arts from the University of Melbourne.
